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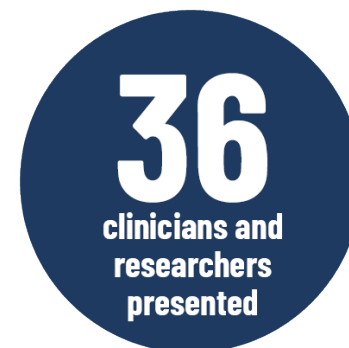
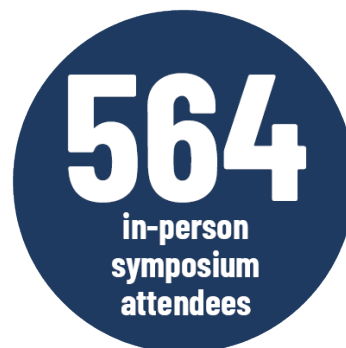
Letter from the IEC President



What an incredibly busy and productive first 5 months we've had in our 10th year as the IEC.

Thank you to everyone who has helped support the four symposia we've presented from February 27 to May 7. Our symposium chairs, faculty, and attendees have all helped us increase our global impact as we celebrate 10 years of IEC programming.

Our IEC staff traveled the equivalent of halfway around the world (13,462 miles [21,665 km]) for these events.

Read about 2025's four already-presented symposia below. The year is far from over. In fact, I'm pleased to announce that the IEC Board has approved the addition of a new symposium this year.

New Symposium Added

As previously announced, we'll present **Atopic Dermatitis Versus Cutaneous T-cell Lymphoma: Challenges & Novel Insights** on September 20 at the EADV meeting in Paris, France. Please register to attend if you haven't already done so.

Then, we will present a **new symposium in November**. This new event, the title of which is to be announced, will be presented November 12 in conjunction with the 6th Inflammatory Skin Disease Summit (ISDS) at the New York Academy of Medicine in New York, NY, USA.

ISDS is presented every other year, alternating between New York City and Vienna, Austria. The IEC has presented a symposium at ISDS in 2016, 2018, 2021 and 2023. (The IEC had not yet formed for the inaugural ISDS meeting 2014.)

Strategic Council Growth

As our symposia schedule grows, so does our council. I'm pleased to announce that we now have 161 Council members in 34 countries. This increase comes after April's IEC Board meeting in which we approved the 5 new Councilors and 5 new Associates, while promoting an Associate to Councilor.

This group of new Councilors marks exciting milestones to increase our diversity and global impact:

- Our first and second PhD Council members (not holding medical degrees)
- Our first member from the Philippines
- Our first Council member who was first an IEC Fellow!

I hope you'll join me in congratulating our new and promoted Council members, who are identified later in this newsletter.

Whether you are a member of the Council or an IEC supporter, you can help us grow strategically. Please share your experiences with the IEC and suggest that qualified professionals **apply to become Council members**. AI in AD? IEC Fellow Works with Mentor on Cross-Sectional Study



IEC Fellow **Vijaytha Muralidharan, MD MRCP (UK)** and her US Clinical Fellowship mentor, IEC cofounder **Dr. Amy Paller, MD**, have undertaken a survey on the use of AI in atopic dermatitis care.

Recent advancements in artificial intelligence (AI) offer promising potential to enhance various aspects of AD care, including diagnosis, treatment personalization, and disease management. However, the integration of AI into clinical practice raises questions about its effectiveness, potential biases, and implications for healthcare professionals and patients.

The survey study, Viewpoints on the Applications of AI in Atopic Dermatitis: A Cross-Sectional Survey, aims to gather insights from a diverse group of stakeholders on their perspectives regarding the use of AI in AD.

Through the survey, Drs. Paller and Muralidharan plan to:

- Assess the perceptions and attitudes of healthcare professionals, researchers, patient groups, and other stakeholders regarding the application of AI in atopic dermatitis care
- Identify perceived benefits and challenges of AI integration in AD care
- Explore concerns related to algorithmic bias in AI systems used for AD.

Dr. Paller is the principal investigator for the study, which will be conducted at several sites, including Ann & Robert H. Lurie Children's Hospital and Northwestern University in Chicago, IL, USA. As part of the study, the survey was sent to IEC Council members for participation.

Dr. Muralidharan's IEC fellowship lasts 1 year (4 weeks in-person) and is funded through a grant from Pfizer. The fellowship requires the Fellow to deliver a presentation at a major conference or submit an abstract or manuscript for publication in a national or international journal. It's expected that a completed manuscript based on this study will be submitted for publication.

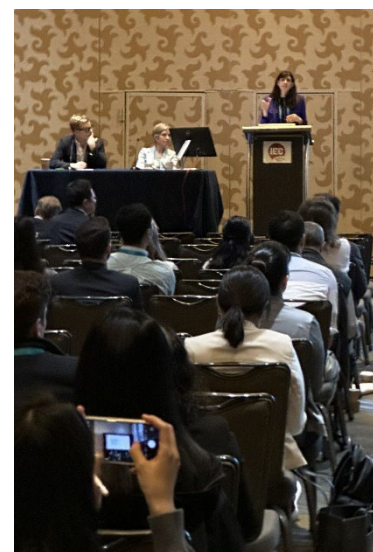

IEC at SID: Multiomics Symposium and PhD Recruitment Breakfast

The IEC presented the symposium **Practical Applications of Multiomics in Atopic Dermatitis** to an audience of more than 160 people on May 7 in conjunction with the 2025 Society of Investigative Dermatology (SID) Annual Meeting in sunny San Diego, CA, USA.

IEC Councilor **Sara Brown, MBChB MD**, of Scotland, UK, and IEC Councilor **Patrick Brunner, MD MSc**, of New York City, NY, USA, successfully chaired the symposia as IEC ambassadors, which bridged the gap between advanced research techniques and clinical practice, focusing on how multiomics can uncover underlying mechanisms of atopic dermatitis. Dr. Brown presented “Genetic and -omic Analyses Give Insight into Fundamental Mechanisms in Atopic Dermatitis” and Dr. Brunner presented “AD and its Mimickers.”

Other faculty members included:

Pediatric Focus Brings IEC to WCPD World Congress in Argentina

Lessons Learned: Practical Strategies for Preventing, Treating, and Managing Atopic Dermatitis in Pediatric Populations was the symposium that the IEC presented on April 7 at the 15th World Congress for Pediatric Dermatology (WCPD) in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

It was expertly co-chaired/moderated by IEC Councilor Dr. Sandipan Dhar, FRCP MD, of Kolkata, India; IEC Associate Dr. Paula C. Luna, MD, of Argentina; and IEC Director, Councilor, Cofounder, and Past President Dr. Amy Paller, MD MS, of Chicago, IL, USA.

The symposium drew nearly 150 attendees to hear from seven expert speakers:

- **IEC President Dr. Alan Irvine, MD DSc** (Dublin, Ireland) on early use of moisturizers to prevent atopic dermatitis.
- **Dr. Carsten Flohr, MA MSc PhD FRCP FRCPCH** (IEC Director and Councilor; London, England, UK) on strategies for preventing and reducing food allergy in babies with AD.
- **Dr. Sandipan Dhar, FRCP MD** (IEC Councilor; Kolkata, India) on examining the diversity of atopic dermatitis in pediatric patients with skin of color.
- **Dr. Lawrence F. Eichenfield, MD** (IEC President-Elect, Director, and Councilor; San Diego, CA, USA) on practical applications in pediatric eczema.
- **IEC Cofounder and Past President Dr. Amy Paller, MD MS** (Chicago, IL, USA) on latest advancements in treating pediatric AD with systemic therapies.
- **Dr. Mark Koh, MD** (IEC Councilor; Singapore) on uniting disciplines for atopic dermatitis and psychosocial management.
- **Dr. Valeria Aoki, MD PhD** (IEC Director and Councilor; São Paulo, Brazil) on navigating adherence and patient education in atopic dermatitis care.

AAD Global Education Day: IEC Leads 3-Group Effort, with Patients

In partnership with the National Alopecia Areata Foundation (NAAF) and the National Eczema Association (NEA), the IEC presented **Converging Pathways: Atopic Dermatitis and Alopecia Areata** on March 6 as part of the AAD Global Education Day in Orlando, FL, USA.

This excellent event drew solid attendance, and we're grateful to NEA and NAAF for partnering with the IEC for its development. Together, the two organizations facilitated and coordinated a meaningful patient panel which enabled a new focus for this IEC event: the stories from patients and care partners navigating atopic dermatitis and alopecia areata.

The symposium was co-chaired by IEC Director, Councilor, Cofounder, and Past President **Dr. Emma Guttman, MD PhD**, of New York, NY, USA, and Dr. Natasha Mesinkovska, MD PhD, of Irvine, CA, USA. It covered pathogenic similarities and differences, epidemiology, and new treatment developments for both conditions. Highlights included presentations by:

- **Dr. Benjamin Ungar, MD** (IEC Councilor; New York, NY) on the epidemiology of alopecia areata and atopic comorbidities.
- **Dr. Peter A. Lio, MD** (IEC Councilor; Chicago, IL) on new treatment developments in atopic dermatitis and how these relate to alopecia areata.
- **Dr. Natasha Mesinkovska, MD PhD** (Irvine, CA) on new treatments for adults with alopecia areata.

The event concluded with a patient discussion panel moderated by Jessica Johnson, MPH, of NEA and George C. Gondo, MA, of NAAF.

A Councilor, Associate, and Industry meeting also was held while we were in Florida. In addition to opportunities for learning, the meeting was a great place for Council members to reconnect.

Meet the Councilor: Aaron Drucker, MD ScM FRCPC



Dr. Aaron Drucker is an IEC Councilor who recently joined our Board of Directors. A dermatologist and researcher, he is an associate professor in the Division of Dermatology at the University of Toronto and a scientist at the Women's College Hospital Research Institute in Toronto, ON, Canada.

He leads an international team conducting a living network meta-analysis of systemic immunomodulatory treatments for eczema, providing up-to-date information to patients and clinicians through [EczemaTherapies.com](https://eczematherapies.com).

How do your personal or professional vision and/or mission align(s) with the IEC vision/mission?

My research focuses on providing reliable answers to questions patients and clinicians face on a day-to-day basis. Whether it's comparing the efficacy of new systemic treatments or evaluating the long-term safety of topical corticosteroids, I try to inform shared decision-making to improve patient care globally.

What is your proudest accomplishment in the atopic dermatitis (AD) space?

Creating a living network meta-analysis of systemic treatments for atopic dermatitis. That project has helped clinicians and patients understand the relative efficacy of new treatments that have been approved since 2017.

What do you value most about being involved with the IEC?

Being part of a community of experts with the shared goal of improving research and care for atopic dermatitis. The atopic dermatitis research community is full of amazing colleagues, and the IEC brings us together.

What do you think will garner the most attention over the coming year in the AD field?

New treatments—can we get closer to our goal of getting the majority of our patients clear with minimal itch?

What do you see as the biggest need among AD patients?

The biggest need is to have a treatment that provides clear skin with minimal itch for the majority of patients who use it. Psoriasis treatment has come a bit farther than atopic dermatitis treatment – but we are getting there.

IEC Presents Course at the AAAAI/WAO Joint Congress in US

The IEC presented **The Impact of Environmental, Food, and Contact Allergies on Atopic Dermatitis** on February 27 at the American Academy of Allergy, Asthma and Immunology (AAAAI) and World Allergy Organization (WAO) Joint Congress in San Diego, CA, USA.

The IEC course cochairs were IEC Councilor **Dr. JiaDe Yu, MD MS**, of Boston, MA, USA, and IEC Councilor **Dr. Ioana Agache, MD**, of Brasov, Romania. Dr. Agache, an allergist, also presented recent understandings in the crosstalk of the skin, gut, and lung epithelia.

The well-attended symposium was a great experience for IEC and attendees. This was the second time that the IEC has presented at AAAAI, a move that helps us expand our reach to international allergists. (We hope to return in 2027.)
