

Dr. April Armstrong is Professor and Chief of Dermatology at University of California Los Angeles (UCLA). Prior to being at UCLA, Dr. Armstrong served as Associate Dean for Clinical Research at the University of Southern California (USC).

Dr. Armstrong is an internationally renowned dermatologist and clinical researcher in inflammatory skin diseases including atopic dermatitis and psoriasis. Dr. Armstrong has conducted over 150 clinical trials and published over 600 articles in scientific journals. Dr.

Armstrong is also a passionate educator, having received numerous awards for her educational efforts.

Dr. Armstrong has a long history of service to the medical profession on a national and international level. Her leadership roles over time include serving as a board member of the International Eczema Council, board member of the American Academy of Dermatology, Chair of the Medical Board at the National Psoriasis Foundation, Co-President of the Group for Research and Assessment of Psoriasis and Psoriatic Arthritis (GRAPPA), President of American DermatoEpidemiology Network, editorial board member of JAMA Dermatology and JAAD, Councilor for the International Psoriasis Council, and a board member for the International Dermatology Outcome Measures (IDEOM). Locally in California, she serves on the board of the California Society of Dermatology and Dermatological Surgery (CalDerm) and was President of Sacramento Valley Dermatological Society.

Dr. Armstrong obtained her medical degree from Harvard Medical School and completed dermatology residency at the Harvard Combined Dermatology Residency Program. She also obtained a Master of Public Health degree from Harvard School of Public Health.
