



Curdin Conrad, MD

Curdin Conrad is a professor of dermatology and head of the Policlinics and the Center for Psoriasis at University Hospital of Lausanne in Switzerland.

He has a strong interest in inflammatory skin diseases, adaptive and innate immunity, and targeted immunotherapies, spanning basic science, translational research, and the clinic. He has fundamentally contributed to today's understanding of psoriasis pathogenesis and has received several scientific awards for his basic and translational research.

He serves as an external scientific expert for several international societies and foundations. Dr. Conrad is a board member of the International Psoriasis Council (IPC), a member of the Board of Directors of the International Societies for Investigative Dermatology (ISID), and President of the European Society for Dermatological Research (ESDR).

He received his MD training at the University of Zurich and participated in the postgraduate course of experimental medicine and biology. After completing dermatology training, he was a research fellow at MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, TX, United States. Over the years, Dr. Conrad has been actively involved in the teaching of evidence-based clinical and scientific dermatology and immunology.
