

Eric Simpson, MD, MCR heads the Department of Dermatology's Clinical Studies Unit at Oregon Health & Sciences University. Dr. Simpson practices medical dermatology with special interests in chronic inflammatory skin diseases and skin cancer. He is actively involved in clinical research and is currently funded by the National Institutes of Health and industry partners to study new approaches to chronic skin disease treatment and prevention.

Dr. Simpson's collaborations are global in scope and has been invited to present his research and approach to patient care at international conferences in Europe, North and South America, and Asia. He has published over 260 scientific articles in several high-impact peer-reviewed journals including the New England Journal of Medicine and The Lancet.

Dr. Simpson supports patient advocacy and improving research quality by serving as Co-Chair of the Harmonizing Outcome Measures in Eczema (HOME)--a volunteer group of patients, providers, and other stakeholders whose mission is to improve the quality of eczema research to better suit the needs of patients and policymakers. He is also serving as Chair of the NEA Research Advisory Committee.
