



Bruce Strober, MD PhD FAAD

Bruce Strober is a clinical professor of dermatology at Yale University School of Medicine in New Haven, CT, USA, and cofounder of Central Connecticut Dermatology in Cromwell, CT, USA.

He is board certified by the American Board of Dermatology and a Fellow of the American Academy of Dermatology.

His primary clinical focus is the treatment of difficult-to-treat inflammatory diseases of the skin, such as psoriasis, atopic dermatitis, and hidradenitis suppurativa. His research interests include the study of old and new therapeutics for inflammatory skin disease, specifically interventions that help patients with difficult-to-treat psoriasis, atopic dermatitis, and hidradenitis suppurativa. Additional research interests include the elucidation of novel features of inflammatory skin disease not previously uncovered and assisting in clarifying the pathophysiology of inflammatory skin disease. He has served as principal investigator or subinvestigator for numerous multicenter clinical studies.

Dr. Strober is the editor in chief of the *Journal of Psoriasis and Psoriatic Arthritis*. He has served as a section editor for the *British Journal of Dermatology* and an ad hoc reviewer for the *Journal of the American Academy of Dermatology*, *JAMA Dermatology*, the *British Journal of Dermatology*, and *The New England Journal of Medicine*. He has published more than 200 book chapters and articles in peer-reviewed journals such as *JAMA Dermatology*, *The New England Journal of Medicine*, the *Journal of the American Academy of Dermatology*, the *Journal of Investigative Dermatology*, and *JAMA*, among others.

Dr. Strober has frequently presented data to the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA), including at the advisory committee for secukinumab, a novel IL-17 inhibitor for treating psoriasis. He is the president of the International Psoriasis Council and scientific codirector of the CorEvitas Psoriasis Registry.

He earned his medical and doctorate degrees from Columbia University in New York City, NY, USA. He completed his residency in dermatology in the Department of Dermatology at New York University School of Medicine in New York City, NY, USA. Before cofounding Central Connecticut Dermatology, Dr. Strober was professor and chair in the Department of Dermatology at the University of Connecticut School of Medicine in Farmington, CT, USA.
